Primary Election August 12, 2014

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a Partisan Primary Election will be held in the Town of Sheridan, on Tuesday, August 12, 2014 from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.. The selection will be made for state offices of Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, State Senator, State Representative to the Assembly, Clerk of Circuit Court and US Representative in Congress.

The state has passed new voting restrictions. In person absentee voting has been reduced to not allow Saturday voting and to limit hours during the week. In person absentee voting will be by appointment only and can only take place between the hours of 9:00 am. to noon and 1:00 pm to 6 pm on July 30 and 31 and August 1, 6, 7 and 8. Call the clerk (David Plunkett) at 715-949-1792 to make an appointment.
